

We live in challenging times. The stories within this book provide a wealth of meaning, inspirational insights and much to be learned from young people.

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


Matthew and billy – Dark Room




It looked pretty cool through the things, it was a nice hot day, relaxing taking photo's. The contrast between nature and manmade, like being in a box, looking out






Like the sun Shines through the trees the disco lights shine through the crowd.
